Additional Wildlife Resources

By state law, you have 24 hours to get the animal to a rehabilitation facility. Keeping an animal may result in it being seized and euthanized. You must call the rehabilitation facility and make a reservation to deliver the animal in advance.

If there are **ducks/geese** crossing or injured wildlife on a highway or major road, **State Patrol** can assist. The number for the Bellevue office is 425-401-7788. A word of caution, stopping traffic to help wildlife is illegal in Washington and is enforced by ticketing.

US Fish and Wildlife may help if it is an endangered or threatened species. They will also help with nuisance Flicker complaints. The Lacey office is closest to Eastside Audubon at 360-753-9440.

WA Dept of Fish and Wildlife will help with loons and swans only. They have a swan hotline for injured swans that runs from Nov-Mar 360-466-4345 ext. 266
